



Introducing The Community Council for Somerset (CCS)



from Izzy and Steve, your Village Agents

Established in 1926, The Community Council for Somerset (CCS) is a charity working in all corners of the County. We believe everyone in Somerset should be able to live a healthy, independent and safe life and be part of a strong and thriving community.

Our work starts on the ground where our teams act as advocates using their local expertise to ensure that each community and its people flourish. Somerset is diverse and vibrant, and we recognise that each town and village is unique. We can react to the changing needs of each community by working in collaboration to facilitate projects and enterprises that support positive change.

As a charity, our work relies on the funding we receive from our partners, who value our knowledge in making sure that the right level of investment is put into the right places, benefiting the people that need it the most.

CCS runs the Somerset Village and Community Agent service. Village Agents provide confidential, practical community-based solutions for people, wherever they are in Somerset.

Our Village Agents host Talking Cafes at over thirty different venues throughout the County. The nearest for Watchet is held in Williton Pavilion every Tuesday between 1 and 3 pm. Talking Cafes provide a local place for people to seek advice and support for a range of different issues that might be causing worry or distress. If our Village Agents can't help, they will know someone who can!

Working with other partners in the voluntary sector, the team have also set up the Somerset Refugee Welcome Hubs in response to the war in Ukraine. We have been conducting the compulsory welfare checks on behalf of the Local Authority and we receive information about hosts/sponsors and guests to enable us to do this.

We also provide a number of specialist agent services that are accessed through referrals via GP's or Adult Social Care services. Our Community Agents will pick up referrals and support people to access community-based solutions to address health and social care needs.

A Homelessness Agent works with multiple organisations to support those facing homelessness in the south of the County.

We have a vital team of Hospital Village Agents who work closely with staff at Somerset's two acute hospitals, Musgrove and Yeovil, as well as all the smaller community and cottage hospitals across Somerset. They support a patient's hospital discharge by providing ward staff and families with alternative possibilities, to help reduce delays once someone is medically fit.

For CCS, collaboration is key to the role we play in supporting our communities. We work with numerous statutory and voluntary services and our employees are dedicated to improving the lives of those who have hit a bump in the road. We are problem-solvers and we help people get back on track.

The newly formed Watchet Wildlife Group is attracting a good deal of interest, with 250 members joining the group's Facebook page already. Watchet is fortunate in having a diverse and fascinating range of wildlife from the wonderful natural wildlife corridor that is our treasured Mineral Line, to woodlands, the delights of our beaches and the many

rock pools inhabited by some wondrous creatures that so fascinate youngsters.

Two highly successful events have taken place. Over seventy turned up for the **Mini Beast Safari** which involved a short walk to the Pleasure Ground. Children sought out and identified a wide range of 'bugs and butterflies', and then made a record of their finds using *iNaturalist* by Elizabeth Atkinson of West Somerset Wildways. This was an amazing introduction to the diversity of wildlife on our doorsteps.

Our second event was a walk along the mineral line led by WWG member Christine LeHegarat, wonderfully chaotic but great fun for children, dogs and adults alike. Both these events were free and it is very much the policy of the WWG that wherever possible future events will also be free. We





have ambitious plans for the future, and it is hoped that many such family events will be held in the New Year. 
We look forward to next March when we start over again! With grateful thanks to Molly and her whole team!

St Decuman's Christmas Tree Festival 2023

This year's event will be staged in St Decuman's from Friday December 1st until Sunday the 3rd culminating on Sunday in the **Annual Festival Christingle Service** at 4pm.

This is a very atmospheric service with all the main church lights turned off and the lights of around 40 trees added to the lit Christingles. On Sunday, the church will be open after the morning 10.45 service through until the Christingle.

From 10am on the Friday the church will be open for viewing, with some stalls and raffles plus teas and coffees. This year there will also be Hot Soups from 12 noon. As darkness falls the event will close on both Friday and Saturday at 4pm.

Saturday will see the addition of the full Fayre with many more cakes (there will be some on Friday). Outside, in our tent, The Rainbows will be cooking from 10am until at least 2pm, dishing up bacon baps etc for your breakfast, mid-morning snacks and lunches.

This year our theme for the Festival is 'Nursery Rhymes, Children's Books or Songs' and as of October 1st some 34 organisations have booked their places. For the first time these include Williton Squirrels, Plastic Free Watchet, and the Flower Arranging Group. Last year we achieved a total of 45 trees, and it looks as though we will reach at least 40 again. It is so gratifying that so many Watchet & Williton Groups come forward to support the event making it a community inspired happy start to the Christmas Season.

The old Civil Parish of St. Decuman's and a discovery!

Nestling between the Quantocks and the Brendon hills, the old civil parish of St. Decuman's occupied the coastal plain at the mouth of a broad valley. On the coast in the north-west corner of the parish is the former borough and market town of Watchet, and two miles south on the southern boundary lies the large village of Williton. Hamlets and farms were scattered throughout the parish and by the 17th century Doniford, Bardon and Stream were the principal hamlets. In 1894 the rural district of Williton was formed and St. Decuman's Parish Council created. The parish was divided in 1902 and Watchet urban district (probably the smallest urban district authority in the country) was formed, with the remainder of the ancient parish becoming the separate civil parish of Williton, Joyce and I have found the old parish boundary sign between Watchet and Williton, still at the side of the road near where it turns into Five Bells. It must be over a hundred years old and is





badly in need of a coat of paint, but the raised words are still visible. I can remember it being painted white with the wording in black. I wonder if Watchet Conservation Society could facilitate this being brought back to life again?

In 1974 the two areas became constituent parishes in the West Somerset district, with Watchet having a Town Council and Williton retaining its Parish Council. Williton then became the centre for much of the administration of West Somerset District Council until its closure in 2023 to form part of the new Somerset Council. In 2013 Mrs. Loretta Whetlor became Watchet's first mayor. Boundary changes were also made in the early 1980s, including the transfer of Rydon to West Quantoxhead.

The total population of St. Decuman's old parish in 1801 was 1,602, rising to 3,302 by 1901. Watchet's population was 1,936 in 1931 and had increased to 4,400 by 2002; Williton's totalled 1,161 in 1931 and 2,710 in 2002. At the present time there are 3,078 people on the Watchet electoral register and 2,200 on Williton's. Besides the expansion of Watchet and Williton in the last and present centuries, two other areas of growth have been Five Bells and Doniford. Some areas of Doniford, where the Swill or Swilly river runs into the sea, are still within Williton parish, while others are part of Watchet. In 1925 there was another milestone in local history with the arrival of the military at Doniford, a link which was to last for over 45 years.



North of Williton is a site named Battlegore (opposite Danesfield School) where a battle against invading Danes is said to have taken place in AD918. An archaeological dig took place there in 1931, but nothing of any significance was found. When Watchet folk good-humorously boast about their sporting prowess over Williton, the inevitable retort they get is: "But it was the Williton lads who sent the Danes packing at Battlegore!"

Prophetess Mother Shipton's tomb in Blackdown Wood, just outside of Stream, is said to be a copy of one at Knaresborough in Yorkshire. Nevertheless, one of her legendary prophecies has been passed down by generations of Williton and Watchet folk:

Watchet and Doniford both shall drown, And Williton become the seaport town.



Watchet Harbour Community Bookshop

The bookshop has had a very successful season. There has been a record amount of sales compared to previous years, despite the Cleeve Hill closure. We have received many compliments about how well our stock is presented and also about the funds we raise for our main charity and for Watchet organisations. Compliments come not only from West Somerset customers but from all over the UK and we are aware that some people come to Watchet specifically to visit the shop, then avail themselves of what the town has to offer.

We have donated £13,000 to the **Cystic Fibrosis Trust** and given 13 grants/sponsorship to local groups totalling £4,640. Grants have been made to, amongst other groups, the Sea of Songs event, the outdoor film (Dirty Dancing) during Summertime and the Guides trip to London.

Please note that in the light of inflation we have increased the maximum grant we normally give to £500.
